QCoast₂₁₀₀ 2.0: Implementation



- Competitive grant program
- Support implementation actions recommended in a CHAS
- Designed to optimise the benefits to councils







QCoast₂₁₀₀ 2.0: Program objective



Demonstrate	innovative and cost-effective solutions
Emphasise	nature-based solutions that preserve the natural character of the coast
Benefit	other councils across the State through joint projects, shared learnings or provide leading practice examples
Provide	leverage for QCoast ₂₁₀₀ funding through partnerships, joint projects, and high co-contributions







QCoast₂₁₀₀ 2.0: Eligibility (Council)



Councils must:

- have developed a CHAS through the QCoast₂₁₀₀ program
 - endorsed or adopted by the council; and
- provide a funding co-contribution







QCoast₂₁₀₀ 2.0: Funding



- Approx. \$2 million available to fund eligible implementation projects
- Individual project budgets based on specific project requirements
- Up to \$200,000 per council
- Co-contribution requirements determined using LGAQ Membership Subscription formula (2021/2022)

Councils are encouraged to seek additional funding from third parties to contribute to the project cost.







QCoast₂₁₀₀ 2.0: Eligibility (Project)



Projects must be:

related to the actions or recommendations in a CHAS or in the Implementation Plan forming part of a CHAS

expected to be able gain development approval requirement under relevant legislation (if required)

identified in a CHAS under development, where a critical need is identified for immediate implementation





QCoast₂₁₀₀ 2.0: Eligibility (Project)



Projects may include:

works or planning for defence of assets and the community from coastal hazards

nature based solutions to address emerging coastal hazards or improve resilience e.g. beach nourishment, mangrove restoration, wave, and current attenuation

evaluation of new approaches and designs to inform future works

community engagement work to refine CHAS actions especially where communities are facing short term hazard threats and solution development is complex or contentious

tenure transition and the asset relocation plans or actions

monitoring or data collection programs which support trigger-based CHAS actions





QCoast₂₁₀₀ 2.0: Assessment criteria



- Progresses actions in a CHAS 'Recommendation' or 'Implementation Plan'
- ☐ Provides a benefit of asset protection and community safety
- Demonstrates innovative designs or new concepts in adaptation
- □ Demonstrates efficiency in the application of QCoast₂₁₀₀ grant funding
 - high co-funding contribution
 - increased funding contribution through partnerships
 - demonstrates that early adoption will lead to future cost savings





QCoast₂₁₀₀ 2.0: Assessment criteria



- □ Adopts 'nature based' solutions that maintain the natural character and processes of the coast
- □ Supports the community to progress solutions including through bespoke engagement and planning for communities at near term risk
- Commences a pathway for other sequential adaptation projects
- ☐ Provides a benefit to other councils in term of shared learnings, demonstration of new or novel approaches and transferrable solutions

Meeting multiple criteria will be of benefit in project assessment






